Samuel 22:29

You are my lamp O Lord; the Lord turns my darkness into light.

Psalm 34: 18-19:

The Lord is near to the brokenhearted,
and saves the crushed in spirit.

Christian Scriptures

Matthew 28:20b

Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.

John 14:18

No, I will not abandon you or leave you as orphans in the storm – I will come to you.

John 14:27

I am leaving you with a gift – peace of mind and heart! And the peace I give isn't fragile like the peace the world gives. So don't be troubled or afraid.

Romans 8:1-2

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set me free from the law of sin and death.

Romans 8:24-25

For we were saved in this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we eagerly wait for it with perseverance.

Romans 8:38-39

For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 14:7-12

For none of us lives to himself, and no one dies to himself. For if we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. Therefore, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and rose and lived again, that He might be Lord of both the dead and the living. But why do you judge your brother? Or why do you show contempt for your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. For it is written:

“As I live, says the Lord,
Every knee shall bow to Me,
And every tongue shall confess to God.”
So then each of us shall give account of himself to God.

[Note: Two elements related to suicide are to be noted in this passage. First, there is the assurance that true believers belong to the Lord, whether they live or die. Suicides are not specifically excluded nor is any particular form of death or life, regardless of how sinful the individual might be. The second element concerns the easy inclination to judge others' actions, whether it be how they observe the day, whether they eat or abstain from eating or if they live or die. Paul clearly condemns those who so quickly judge other's behavior in apparently trivial matters. By so doing they overlook the essential theological point Paul is making. Conceivably this passage might also come as a form of assurance to Christians contemplating suicide, in which case the final statement might be taken as a word of promise, rather than a threat. 2 Corinthians 4:8-9

We are pressed on every side by troubles but not crushed and broken. We are perplexed because we don't know why things happen as they do, but we don't give up and quit. We are hunted down, but God never abandons us. We get knocked down, but we get up again and keep going.”

Romans 15:4:

For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.

Ephesians 1:18-19

I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and his incomparably great power for us who believe.

Phillipians 1:6

For I am confident of this very thing, that He Who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.

Philippians 1:20-26 (NIV)

I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. ²¹ For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. ²² If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! ²³ I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is

better by far; ²⁴ but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. ²⁵ Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that through my being with you again your boasting in Christ Jesus will abound on account of me.
[Note: Paul is contemplating whether it is better to live or die. He is hard pressed to decide between the two; however, he chooses life.]
